CYPW Level 3 Apprenticeship

As a Childcare Worker you will make a positive different in a young person's life. You will be responsible for planning daily routines, implementing activities and providing general care for the individuals within your setting. You will be expected to execute maturity, resilience and initiative to support the young people and build on their development of life skills and education. By providing care, guidance and direction at the frontline of social care, you will be instrumental in improving the health and well-being of those receiving care and support.

Entry Requirements

Apprentices must be at least 16 years of age. There are no other set entry requirements.

Functional Skills

Apprentices will achieve their level 2 functional skills in Maths, English and ICT as part of the level 3 CYPW Social Care Pathway qualification.

Main Qualification Structure

Apprentices must gain a minimum of 65 credits to achieve the Edexcel Level 3 Diploma for the Children and Young People's Workforce (QCF). To do this, they must achieve 27 credits from the mandatory group of units,13 credits from the social care pathway units. The remaining credits must be achieved from the relevant optional unit group.

Duration

This course typically takes 12 - 18 months to complete.

Progression

Learners can progress to the Level 3 ILM in leadership and management depending on the context in which they work.

Learners can progress into the following employment – care worker, foster carer, residential care worker, youth and community worker, children's centre care worker, and also progress to be team leader or supervisor.



Qualifications

The qualification will be assessed using a range of methods. This could include direct observation in the workplace, a portfolio of evidence, written assignments or a task.

Level

This is a Level 3 apprenticeship.

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
